







#### Provisional


Composition of the European Parliament based on available provisional or final national results published after voting has finished in all Member States, based on the structure of the outgoing Parliament.

#### European Parliament 2024-2029 vs. 2019-2024









## Horizon scan: Global issues


Here we captured the global and EU drivers of change over the medium to long term War and civil unrest: Ukraine, Gaza, Red Sea...

Powerful leadership: US, China, India (+ 50x elections)




### Horizon scan: Food and drink issues

Here we captured the issues related directly to food and drink.




## Horizon scan: Analysis and trends

## Horizon scan: Opportunities

Based on the analysis above, we identified the following opportunities for FoodDrinkEurope to help lead and shape the EU conversation Develop a long-term vision to show how <u>a</u> <u>competitive, market</u> <u>driven industry can</u> <u>deliver growth</u>, sustainability, supply chain fairness and benefit consumers.



Demonstrate <u>the value of</u> processing to sustainable food systems and <u>healthier</u> diets.

Amplify independent science on healthy diets (nutrition v level of processing)

Show policymakers <u>a clear</u> <u>net zero pathway</u> to allow the food and drink industry to remain competitive and play its part in scope 1, 2 and 3 reduction.
